



Weather

The weather in Saskatoon is usually dry and sunny. Summer daytime temperatures range from 20 °C to 35 °C (68 °F to 95 °F). Evenings are cool, requiring a light sweater or jacket. Winter temperatures vary from +5 °C to -30 °C (41 °F to -22 °F). Average annual rainfall of 265mm ensures lush gardens, parks, and golf courses. In winter, snowfall is sufficient to encourage many winter sports.

Saskatoon, SK is located in the middle of Saskatchewan, 260 km (162 miles) from the Regina, the capital of the middle prairie province. Saskatoon is equipped with seven bridges within the city due to the city being placed on the banks of the South Saskatchewan River; this





makes for a beautiful natural setting within the city limits!
