

Weather

The average temperature in Toronto ranges from -6° C in the winter months to 27° C in the summer. The warm season lasts from May to September, the cold season from late November to March. The cold season usually sees snowfall starting in November and lasting until March or April, with an average of 130 cm of snowfall each

year. Although the winter average goes down to only -6° C, the winter weather can sometimes be down to -25° C; it is important to be prepared for cold weather with winter clothes including a thick, windproof coat, a scarf for the neck and face, gloves, warm underwear, a winter hat that can cover your ears, and warm boots that are lined and/or waterproof.
