

Weather

The Greater Trail area has a moderate climate with low humidity, hot dry summers, and relatively mild winters. The average daily maximum temperature in July is 28 degrees Celsius with extreme highs up to 39.6 degrees Celsius.



The average daily minimum for January is -5.9 degrees Celsius with extreme lows down to -25.7 degrees Celsius. The average annual precipitation is 731 mm. To see the current weather in Trail, click here.

Location

Trail is a city in the West Kootenay region of the Interior of British Columbia, Canada. Nelson is just 1 hour away and Spokane, Washington, is 2.5 hours away. Fruitvale and Rossland are nearby towns that some residents choose to call home and commute to Trail for work.

Air

The nearest major airport is <u>Kelowna International Airport</u> which is 315 km from Trail, BC.

The closest domestic airports are <u>Trail Regional Airport</u> which is 14km from the center of the city and <u>West Kootenay Regional Airport</u> which is 31km from Trail, BC.
