Dawson Creek is a city located in the northeastern Peace Region of British Columbia. Home to approximately 11, 000 people, it is known as the "Capital of the Peace" City.

The city sits on historic "Mile 0" off the Alaska Highway. The "Mile 0" post still resides downtown and is an important part of Dawson Creek's heritage. Lots of annual events are hosted here, the largest of which are showcase art, music, and rodeo.

### Recreation

Recreation facilities include two ice hockey arenas, a curling rink, an indoor swimming pool, an outdoor ice rink, and a speed skating oval. The city also has exhibition grounds featuring an indoor rodeo arena and a 4,000-seat convention centre/ice arena with skyboxes. Nearby Bear Mountain, located south of the city, provides over 20 km (12 mi) of snowshoeing and cross-country skiing trails, areas for downhill skiing, and about 500 km (300 mi) of trails for snowmobiles, mountain bikes, and all-terrain vehicles.

**Forestry:** the 2.9-million-hectare Dawson Creek Forest District provides an estimated 1,700 jobs, ranging from truck drivers and equipment operators to camp crews. Species harvested include spruce, pine, balsam, and aspen, in quantities enough to build more than 33,000 houses annually! An extensive silviculture program is in place.



Agriculture: With close to 2.5 million acres

in production, the Peace Region is the largest agricultural region in British Columbia, and home to some 1,800 farms, producing well over \$100 million worth of product annually.
