Bonnyville, Alberta is situated in east-central Alberta between the City of Cold Lake and the Town of St. Paul. The town and surrounding area offers campsites, hiking trails, lakes and golfing in the summer months and cross-country skiing, ice-fishing and snowmobiling when the snow starts to fall. The town itself is situated right on Jessie Lake, with several other lakes in the nearby surrounding area. The Town of Bonnyville's 2012 municipal census counted a population of 6,837, 5.7% increase over its 2009 census. Bonnyville has a diverse mix of residence and is home to numerous French-speaking residents and many Ukrainian-Canadians.

Weather

Bonnyville's climate is humid continental, characterized by large seasonal temperature differences, with warm to hot (and often humid) summers and cold (sometimes severely cold) winters.

Real Estate & Rental

Housing opportunities are provided by local realtors and by postings placed in the local newspaper, the Bonnyville Nouvelle.

Bonnyville is located in central Alberta, close to the Saskatchewan border. Bonnyville is located on the north shore of Jessie Lake. The lake is an important staging area for thousands of migrating birds, and therefore attracts birdwatchers. Other nearby lakes include Moose Lake and Muriel Lake.

Transportation

The [Northern Express Bus Line](#) provides a daily return bus service north towards Cold Lake and south towards the city of Edmonton.

[Edmonton International Airport](#) is just under 3 hours from Bonnyville, serving flights to and from destinations across Canada and the U.S.

Bonnyville Regional Airport is a small unmanned airport located just outside the town. The airport serves as a point of call for commercial, corporate and general aviation, and services both private and commercial rotary winged and fixed-wing operators located on site. The airport is maintained by the Town of Bonnyville Public Works Department, call 780-826-3550 for further information.

Industry

Bonnyville's economy is based on nearby oil reserves and agricultural resources, and benefits from its location between the markets of St. Paul and Cold Lake. It is also a major retail and service center for the area with many local government offices based in the town.

Recreation

Bonnyville offers many outstanding lakes and rivers. Situated on the southern edge of the boreal forest, Bonnyville is an angler's paradise. Anglers may land northern pike, tasty perch, whitefish, walleye, lake trout and rainbow trout. There are opportunities to camp at fully serviced campgrounds at Vesseau Beach on Moose Lake, listen to the loons while the sunlight fades. Muriel Lake also has several beaches and recreational areas with a selection of accommodation available to suit all budgets.

Bonnyville Golf and Country Club offers suburb golfing in the summer months on their 18 hole course. The summer also brings a wide range of celebrations to Bonnyville including the annual rodeo, chuckwangan racing and family fun for Bonnyville's Canada Day celebrations.
