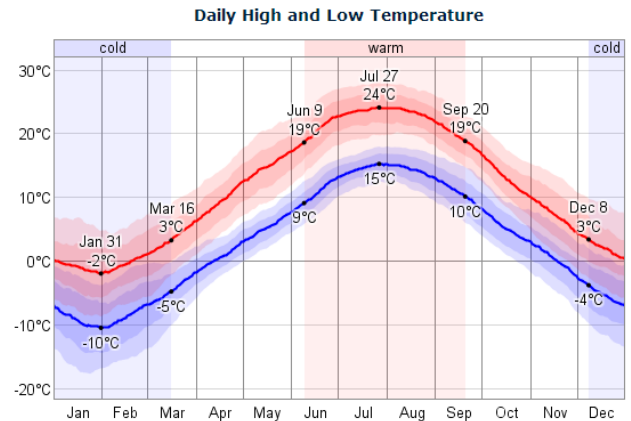

The temperature in Halifax ranges from a high of 24° C in the summer months (June to September) to -10° C in the winter months (December to March). Disturbed, changeable weather is common throughout the year. Snow depths greater than 1 cm are seen on about 85 days each year in Halifax on average.
