The Town of Slave Lake is situated in Northern Alberta on the largest recreational lake in the province. The population of Slave Lake is 6,800 and provides services for 20,000 residents in the region. There are plenty of amenities and lots of campgrounds, hiking trails, wildlife, beaches, boat launches, and incredible fishing.

Slave Lake has been growing steadily for two decades. It is a progressive community based on natural resources such as oil and forestry; while many make their living from hunting, fishing, and tourism. These industries all have a collective environmental consciousness that respects wildlife habitat and clean rivers and lakes. There are ample recreational facilities for all sports, a vibrant arts and culture community, and plenty of volunteers to share in all hobbies and pursuits.

Recreation

The beautiful outdoors are a major attraction in Slave Lake. The shallow, sand-based bottom of Lesser Slave Lake offers some of the finest swimming in Alberta. Devonshire Beach, 5 minutes north of Town, is the most highly recommended spot for swimming with 8km of sandy beach. There is excellent camping and fishing in the nearby provincial parks.



The town is well equipped with an arena, climbing wall, and aquatic centre. There are also plenty of bars and restaurants, shops, a movie theatre, and museum.
