



Transportation

Air

The nearest major airport is Kelowna International Airport (YLW / CYLW). This airport has international and domestic flights and is 16 km from the center of Kelowna. Kelowna's International Airport is one of the top ten airports in Canada, serving over one million passengers annually.

Ground

Kelowna has a number of different modes of ground transportation which include taxi service, [BC Transit bus routes](#), and [Greyhound Lines](#). Major Highway 97 passes through Kelowna. It is the longest continuously-numbered route in the province of British Columbia (and the longest provincial highway in any province), running 2,081 km (1,293 mi) from the Canada/U.S. border near Osoyoos in the south to the British Columbia/Yukon boundary in the north at Watson Lake, Yukon.
