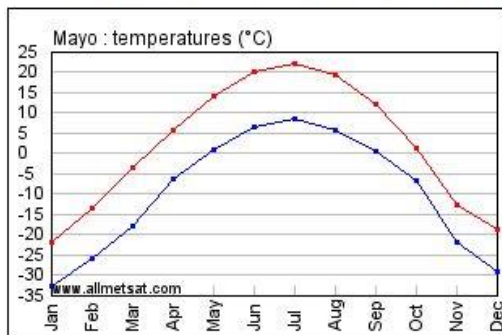

Beautiful scenery and extensive history make Mayo a significant tourist destination. The community is a convenient base for wilderness tourism, canoeing, hiking, big-game hunting and fly-in fishing. The economy of Mayo is linked to providing services for the people of Mayo and the surrounding area.

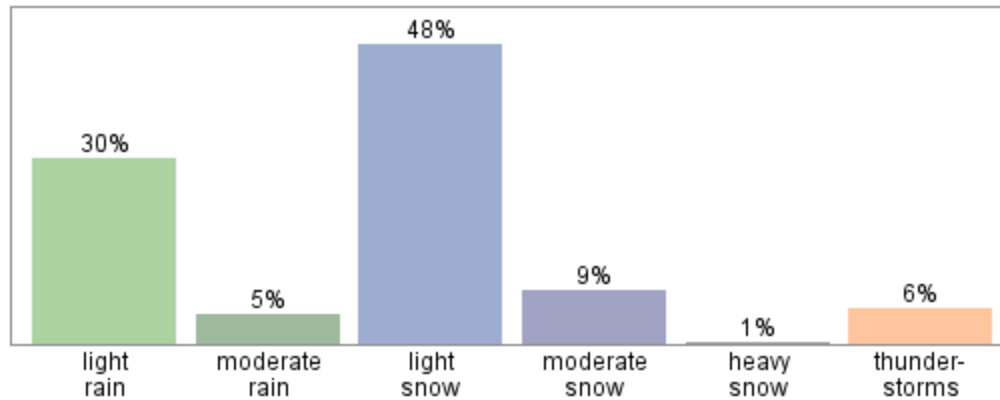

Taxes

The territories of Yukon, Northwest Territories, and Nunavut do not have HST or territorial sales taxes. Only the GST is collected. The three northern jurisdictions are heavily subsidized by the federal government, and its residents receive some additional tax concessions due to the high cost of living in the north.
